MAY THE LORD DEPEND ON YOU

A CHALLENGING ALLEGORY:

When our Lord 'arrived' back in Heaven, He was met by an angel who asked Him who was to carry on the work He had started.

"I have formed the Church," said our Lord. "And what does the Church comprise?" asked the angel.

"Men and women," answered our Lord. "Oh," said the angel, "but what if they fail?"

"I have made no other plan," said our Lord.

Lord over Life

This Thursday is Ascension Day, one of the major feasts of the Church. Jesus' rising to the Father is mentioned in the Prayer of the Day with God who 'led the Messiah through suffering into risen life, and took him up into the glory of heaven.' That is impressive company, to be grouped with Jesus' death and resurrection. What do we understand about this major tenet of our Faith?

In the Nicene Creed, we profess that Jesus "ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father." This does not mean that we have to accept as literal fact that Jesus' glorified body elevated before the apostle's very eyes until he was too small to be seen, and that he kept going until he finally reached the extra-terrestrial throne of his Father, light years beyond any known galaxy.

When we say Jesus ascended, we mean it is in the same sense as 'the King ascended to the throne.' We mean that, just as the Father raised Jesus from the dead, so too did he elevate him to dominion over heaven and earth. Because he 'emptied himself, taking the form of a servant ... and became obedient unto death ... therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.' (Philippians 2:7-11)

The Resurrection proclaims that Jesus is Lord over death; the Ascension declares that he is Lord over life.

"Bearing fruit through ministry"

We met in 2018 while leading Ichthus Camps together. Over the years we have seen dozens of teenagers experiencing awareness of God at these camps, sometimes for the first time. We have seen one teenager, in particular, go from being completely disinterested in God to then being curious to then being willing to explore faith more deeply.

We feel called by God to bear fruit by leading Ichthus Camps and being part of our intentional community, Community of the Way, based at St Francis College. Other Christians are chosen to bear fruit through other ministries. This line of scripture from John 15.16 helps give you a sense of purpose, as you know that God has chosen you for your role. When you see teenagers come through the camps and then become leaders, you see "the fruit that will last" and the knock-on effect of people sharing their faith with others, who then have the confidence to share their faith, and so on.

It is reassuring to know that you are chosen and have a purpose. This equips you to bear fruit, which creates this knock-on effect.

This week, maybe you can think about what ministry you are called to or how the ministry you are currently involved in is bearing fruit.
