Why does that large candle burn?

The Great Fifty Days

Perhaps you have noticed that large Paschal Candle standing near the altar and sometimes beside the baptismal font. It will burn throughout Eastertide to symbolise the presence of the Risen Christ with and among his people.

The Easter season (Eastertide) is the oldest in the Christian calendar; covering the fifty days between the two original feats of the Church, Easter and Pentecost (50 days after). The season's English name, *Easter*, is derived from *Eostre*, a Teutonic goddess of spring, who gave her name to what then corresponded to the month of April.

The whole season of Easter is a festival season. All the Sundays are part of the season and so are called Sundays of Easter, therby reemphasising the

unity of the fifty-day period.

The early Christians also associated baptism closely with Eastertide because they saw a parallel with the death and resurrection of Christ. The immersion under the water became a symbolic death, and the re-emergence a symbolic resurrection. The preparation for baptism at Eastertide became the basis for the development of Lent.

The Paschal Candle is the symbol of Christ's presence on earth and has as its parallel the pillar of fire that went before the Israelites to guide them during

the Exodus.

Sometime we walk by great symbols in our Church. Let them speak to you as they have to others in the past.

The Monday after Easter day I found myself scrolling through Facebook admiring all of the beautiful posts about the resurrection and the excitement surrounding the season. As I was scrolling, an advertisement caught my eye. The Advertisement read: "How to increase your Christian seminar profit to 10,000, 20,000, even 60,000 dollars a session!". Suddenly, my blissful scroll through posts about the resurrection was shattered with a stark reality of a distortion of the Gospel. Unfortunately this advertisement would be met with thoughts of thanks for financial "blessing" in many peoples minds. Is this monetisation of the Good News really what Jesus and the first disciples were on about? Did I have any cause for my heart to be troubled? Or was this simply a responsible economic way to spread the Word?

On this second Sunday of Easter this very topic is approached by our reading from Acts. Our Gospel reading indicates that Jesus appeared to a frightened and unsure group of people. People who needed nothing more than their Christ's promise of the Holy Spirit in order to do the work they were called to do.

What is our calling today? How is the image of the first community in Acts challenging our current systems? What do we need in order to live out our calling? Blessings,
