Myanmar is on the brink of a major humanitarian catastrophe, and needs urgent help from us and the outside world now.

The combined impact of a third wave of COVID-19 now besieging the country and the change in the political situation on 1 February this year has been severely challenging the Myanmar people .

Like many other countries around the world, Myanmar has faced the challenges of the coronavirus pandemic since March 2020. The first wave and the subsequent second wave in September 2020 were managed reasonably well, with COVID-19 care centres established in accessible locations.

But many of these centres, including clinics and hospitals, have now been closed. Right now, people are dying in their homes, without access to essential medicines and facilities.

It is a common scene in the streets of Yangon and Mandalay to see long queues of people carrying oxygen cylinders for refilling, to use at home for family members who are sick with COVID-19. This has become a daily struggle for many.

Unofficial sources report that up to 80% of the population in the Yangon region may be infected with the virus.

There are also reports of significant numbers of internally displaced peoples (IDPs) lacking food and basic essentials. Many need food relief, as well as access to alternative livelihoods while there is uncertainty in the political situation.

ABM's longstanding partner, the Church of the Province of Myanmar (CPM), is responding to the situation with plans for reinforcing COVID-19 prevention methods, providing vital information about home care for family members suffering from COVID-19, and medicine and food relief to those it can reach.

ABM is appealing for funds to send to CPM for this vital work. The church expects to reach up to 5,000 families.

Archbishop Phillip encourages us to pray for the people of Myanmar and to support the ABM Emergency Appeal.

## Reflection

"(God) did not discriminate between us and them, for he purified their hearts by faith." ([Acts 15.9](#))

### "Transformed People Transform People"

I used to find it hard to forgive others. As a good kid I hated when the bad ones could 'get away with murder' when they said "sorry". It wasn't until I myself made a big mistake, repented, and got a taste of what it was like to be forgiven, that I started being less harsh on others.

In today's passage the Apostle Peter responded to Jewish followers of Jesus who demanded that non-Jewish believers should practise all their laws also. He emphatically reminds the early Christians to remember that God loves everyone, including the Gentiles, not because of how good any of them are, but because of how good God is. God "made a choice" to accept all of us as we are without discrimination.

No one can follow the law perfectly. And, that's the point of God's love: while we were still 'Gentiles' God loved us first. It is only through Grace that any of us can know and be transformed by God. (v. 11) So when we seek to force upon others, especially those who are considered to be on the outside (such as people seeking asylum, people from the LGBTIQ+ community, First Nations peoples, the list goes on) the way we want them to live, are we not like those in Acts who fall into the trap of thinking that the law is what makes us God's chosen people?

Lord, help us to be merciful and inclusive. May we extend the same grace shown to us in Christ Jesus to *all* others, Amen.
