



The Bread of Life

I easily could have focused on COVID-19 troubles during our most recent lockdown, 'feeding' on negative news. Then I remembered to turn back to be 'fed' by the Word, the Bread of Life, in my Bible. I found myself uplifted and spiritually encouraged.

John chapter 6 presents Jesus Christ as the Living Bread from heaven that sustains and supports life. He is not medicine that prevents disease, cake enjoyed as a desert, or candy enjoyed for its sweetness. He is the Bread of Life that is essential for life!
