Ten Commandments For Christmas

- You shall not leave 'Christ' out of Christmas.
- You shall not value your gifts by their cost, for many shall signify love that is more blessed and beautiful than silver and gold.
- You shall give yourself with your gifts, your love, your personality, and your friendship shall increase the value of your gifts an hundredfold and he that receives it shall treasure it for ever.
- You shall not let Santa Claus take the place of Christ, lest Christmas become a fairy story rather than a sublime reality in the spiritual realm.
- You shall not burden your friends, the sales assistant, the postal officer and the merchant, but shall have your consideration.
- You shall not neglect your Church. Its Christmas services are planned to help spiritualise the Christmas season for you, your family and friends.
- You shall not neglect the needy. Let your bountiful blessings be shared with the many who will go hungry and without unless you are generous at Christmas.
- You shall be as a little child. Christmas is the day of the Christ Child. Not until you have become in spirit as a little child, are you ready to enter the Kingdom of Heaven.
- You shall prepare your soul for Christmas. Most of us spend much time and money getting gifts ready, but few seconds in preparing our souls.
- You shall give your heart to Christ. Let your Christmas list have Christ at the top and your heart as your gift. In so doing, you are as the Wise Men of old, and truly you will find yourself born again on Christmas Day.

When you read investing advice, articles will usually have a disclaimer that says something like, "past performance is not a guarantee of future returns." This is because the stock market is irregular.

With God, it's a completely different story. God is steadfast and trustworthy. So with God, past performance does say something about the future. The Bible is full of recitations of God's mighty deeds from the past. These are not included because of nostalgia.

Too often, our churches are infected by toxic nostalgia. We are tempted to remember "the good old days" which weren't nearly as good as we remember them. We use our energy grieving a reality that doesn't fit our memory of the past. We want to recreate some time from the past rather than pushing ahead.

We might be tempted to misread the recitations of history in the Bible. They aren't there for nostalgia! God's past deeds are remembered so that we always remember that God acts on our behalf.

This Sunday, we will hear the Magnificat in our lectionary readings. Mary's song of praise is a remembrance of God's deeds in the past. And that look backwards is meant to encourage us about the future.

As we look toward Christmas, we do well to recall how God has entered our world to redeem us. And we can expect God to work in our lives and in our world.

"When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and exclaimed with a loud cry, 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb." (Luke 1.41-42)

"Welcoming all expectant mothers"

Like Mary, I had a son at a young age. Even though I had just left school, I knew I was responsible for carrying this son, raising him and my future three sons to be strong, dependable men so they would care for their families and Elders. Also, like Mary, I had cousins who were pregnant at the same time as me in my Kuku Yalanji community in Mossman. We raised our children together and were always welcomed by our family and community members, who looked out for us and our bubbas. We were cared for by the Elders, who cooked us fresh Milku (mullet) soup, which is very high in omegas and thus nourishing for babies.

I heard this scripture being read recently in church. It's been a long time since I've heard it. What stood out to me when listening to the minister preach was how precious it is to God that women bear children. God nourished and guided me in my own pregnancies, especially through my family and community who welcomed and cared for me.

I think that stigma remains in the wider community when young women become pregnant – they are still sometimes shunned. We all need to do our bit to support any woman who is pregnant, especially given all she is going through with hormone changes, morning sickness, an identity shift and the new pressure of responsibility. How we view women impacts how we treat them.

Being a welcoming people means caring for all expectant mums, just as Elizabeth and Mary cared for each other.
