URGENT ASSISTANCE NEEDED -

1 **Delivery Driver/s**

Someone who can pick up unusable and unwanted goods from the Op Shop and deliver them to other Op Shops etc in the area and/or the local tip.

Mostly it's just the boot and/or maybe rear seat of a sedan. Often it's not a weekly service and it can be done in your own time.

Sometimes a trailer may be required and it would be great if someone with a trailer could volunteer their services when this is needed.

2 **Government Grants/Funding Applications**

Someone who has the patience to read the requirements, gather the documents and information required and fill in the prescribed forms is needed.

There are others who can and will assist in the information gathering but we need someone who can take the lead role in the process.

There are deadlines for submission, but once the applications have been submitted, it becomes a waiting game until we need to give the Government Authority an update of the spending of the Grant Monies.

It is hoped to place some relocatable style sheds or similar on site at Deception Bay to house the growing needs of the Op Shop and Emergency Food Pantry.

Reflection

"The Lord blessed the latter days of Job more than his beginning" ([Job 42.12](#))

"With truth's bitterness comes blessing"

When I was growing up the only man in my village in South Sudan who believed in Jesus was my uncle, Paul Majak, as everyone else worshipped the local gods. In a single year, my uncle lost five children who were killed at different times in bomb explosions, in child birth and while fighting in the war. He also lost his wife in the same year while she was giving birth.

Villagers made fun of him, asking him in a teasing way where his God was now as he had lost his wife and all of his children, except one daughter, within 10 months. Despite losing so much, he remained obedient to God like Job and continued to praise him. The courage he showed through his affliction eventually inspired other villagers to worship Jesus as the true God. Now, there is a big church in my village. Many years later, I spoke to him on the phone and he told me that he had been blessed like Job in his later years, as God had blessed him with more children.

Both my uncle and the story of Job have taught me that the most important things are faith and trust in God. If we have faith and trust in God, we can leave the rest to God.

The trials of the righteous are often so many, but with obedience, faith and trust God will set us free from our affliction.
